f. **STAFF UPDATES**

Staff provided an overview of current operations and programming across all divisions. Administration reported 13 park shelter rentals for March and 20 for February. Community Engagement highlighted key initiatives, including the Spring Eggstravaganza, Color Run/Walk 3K, and Black History Month Spotlight. In Sports, the staff completed 66 games during the season playoffs.

Contract Classes currently serve 168 active participants across youth and adult programs. Child Development facilitated activities such as Valentine Grams and the “Jailhouse Rock” performance.

Social Recreation Programs continue to offer Teen Socials on the fourth Friday of each month, along with a Mentor Program and a budgeting workshop. Rec N' Roll featured Valentine-themed slime and craft activities held on Saturdays from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

The Fitness and Aquatic Center continues to provide swim lessons, including those supported through Red Cross scholarships. Senior Services hosted the Senior Sweethearts' Dance. Parks Maintenance completed ballfield preparation for Opening Day and continues to implement the ongoing park improvement project.

Fergusson Park will be starting soon. We are waiting on the colors to arrive.

Inclusive Playground: the equipment is on its way. Specifications are being reviewed by building and safety. Looking to be completed by Summer 2026.

Birdsall Park: The building will be delivered end of May and we anticipate the project being completed in early July.

Carl Johnson Center: They are working on getting the designs done for the new bleachers and the winches so it can go out to bid.

Sensory room: is being painted and lights are being installed. The project is coming along. We are looking at asking for a Contract service agreement to bring a Recreation Therapist to training and work with staff so we can be more inclusive.

Commissioner Hinojosa: Thank you for all the info its good to see the city investing in the community. We were able to get a field trip scheduled to Joe Sampson Park and the Farmers market. We will work with the Gardens and have a presentation with the master gardener (Tim). This will happen on April 29th. He got a bus from his principle. This is a trial run. ELP students

Wanted to check on the Fergusson park Complaint did she follow up? Is working with the Juneteenth Committee and will bring up the parking issues. Block the area off where the houses are and put the vendors there. Loves the idea of the sensory room, even if you don't have disabilities sensory room is cool. The arts council is hoping we can pick that back up with the policy. We are half way through the process, are there anything we need to do to get it going? Noticed Mr. Wilson is no longer with us, hopes he's ok. Recognition of parks and rec team can we do it at the end of our year in June. We have a great team, in summer they work above and beyond. Its been a while since we did that. I like to celebrate the people and say thank you. The beautiful thing about that we are the second line under city council. I want to make sure they know we appreciate them.
