WHEREAS, there is a shortage of affordable housing in the City of Rialto (“City”) as documented in the 2021-2029 (6th Cycle) General Plan Housing Element; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 65580(d) states that all cities have a responsibility to use the powers vested in them to facilitate the improvement and development of housing and to make adequate provisions for the housing needs of all economic segments of the community; and

WHEREAS, consistent with State Law, Housing Goal 2 is to “Promote and encourage housing development that adequately meets the needs of all socioeconomic segments of the community and region”; and

1 WHEREAS, in order to implement Housing Element Goal 2, Housing Program 2B,
2 referred to as the Rezone Program, calls for the City to rezone to provide adequate sites to
3 accommodate RHNA; and

4 WHEREAS, the City's Rezone Program includes a Housing Opportunity District overlay
5 in the Foothill Central Specific Plan affecting approximately 170 parcels totaling approximately
6 173 acres; and

7 WHEREAS, the City's Rezone Program includes a provision to permit at least twenty units
8 per acre on sites identified in the housing element; and

9 WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an Initial
10 Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) was prepared for the draft 2021-2029 Housing
11 Update in compliance with CEQA and the local environmental review guidelines;

12 WHEREAS, on January 21, 2026, the Planning Commission of the City of Rialto
13 conducted a duly noticed public hearing, as required by law, on Specific Plan Amendment (SPA)
14 No. 25-0001; heard public testimony; discussed SPA No. 25-0001; and closed the public hearing;
15 and

16 WHEREAS, all legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Planning Commission of the City of Rialto
18 as follows:

19 SECTION 1. The Planning Commission hereby specifically finds that all of the facts set forth
20 in the recitals above of this Resolution are true and correct and incorporated herein.

21 SECTION 2. The City of Rialto is the Lead Agency for SPA No. 25-0001, as determined
22 by CEQA. Based on the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the 2021-2029 (6th
23 Cycle) General Plan Housing Element (Environmental Assessment Review No. 25-0020), it has
24 been determined that SPA No. 25-0001 will not have significant adverse impact on the
25 environment with mitigation incorporated. SPA No. 25-0001 is within the scope of the IS/MND
26

and no subsequent environmental review is required per CEQA Guidelines Sections 15162–15164 as provided by Resolution No. _____ which incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 3. The Planning Commission hereby recommends that the City Council adopt the enclosed ordinance (Exhibit “A”) entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIALTO, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING SPECIFIC PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 25-0001 TO ESTABLISH A HOUSING OPPORTUNITY DISTRICT OVERLAY IN THE FOOTHILL CENTRAL SPECIFIC PLAN TO ACCOMMODATE HOUSING IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE HOUSING ELEMENT REZONE PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION PROJECT.

SECTION 4. When adopted, the contents of Exhibit A will supersede the prior zoning overlay.

SECTION 5. The Chairman of the Planning Commission shall sign the passage and adoption of this resolution and thereupon the same shall take effect and be in force.

1 **WHEREAS**, in order to implement Housing Element Goal 2, Housing Program 2B,
2 referred to as the Rezone Program, calls for the City to rezone to provide adequate sites to
3 accommodate RHNA; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the City's Rezone Program includes a Housing Opportunity District
5 residential overlay affecting a total 315 parcels totaling approximately 323 acres city-wide; and

6 **WHEREAS**, the City's Rezone Program includes a Housing Opportunity District overlay
7 in the Foothill Central Specific Plan affecting approximately 170 parcels totaling approximately
8 173 acres; and

9 **WHEREAS**, the City's Rezone Program includes a provision to permit at least 20 units
10 per acre on sites identified in the housing element; and

11 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Initial
12 Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) was prepared for this Project in compliance with
13 CEQA and the local environmental review guidelines; and

14 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Government Code Sections 65450-65457, on January 21, 2026,
15 the Planning Commission of the City of Rialto conducted a duly noticed public hearing, as required
16 by law, on Specific Plan Amendment (SPA) No. 25-0001; heard public testimony; discussed SPA
17 No. 25-0001; and closed the public hearing and forwarded a recommendation to the City Council
18 for action; and

19 **WHEREAS**, the final adoption of the IS/MND and approval of the draft Specific Plan
20 Amendment shall be considered by the City Council as the final approval authority, after
21 evaluation of the environmental document; and

22 **WHEREAS**, all legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Ordinance have occurred.

23 **NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of Rialto, California, does hereby ordain
24 as follows:

1 **SECTION 1.** The City Council hereby specifically finds that facts set forth in the recitals
2 above of this Resolution are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

3 **SECTION 2.** Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an Initial
4 Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) was prepared for the draft 2021-2029 Housing
5 Element Update in compliance with CEQA and the local environmental review guidelines. SPA No.
6 25-0001 is within the scope of the IS/MND, which is incorporated herein by this reference, and no
7 subsequent environmental review is required per CEQA Guidelines Sections 15162–15164. The City
8 Council hereby adopts the IS/MND and finds that, based upon the IS/MND, there is no substantial
9 evidence of environmental impacts.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Foothill Central Specific Plan shall be amended to revise the following
11 sections in the manner shown, with underlined text representing added language. All unmarked text
12 shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect, the Foothill Central Specific Plan shall be
13 amended to read as follows:

14
15 “5.5 Land Use Districts, 5.5.2 Intent and Purpose

16 **Housing Opportunity District:** Parcels within the Foothill–Central Specific Plan designated for
17 residential opportunity in the City’s 2021–2029 Housing Element shall be subject to the Housing
18 Opportunity District regulations contained in Chapter 18.116 of the Rialto Municipal Code. Where
19 conflicts occur between this Specific Plan and Chapter 18.116, the provisions of Chapter 18.116 shall
20 govern.”

22 “Table 5-1 - Permitted Uses

23 Notes:

24 9. Within parcels identified as part of the Housing Opportunity District (HOD), residential uses
25 permitted under Rialto Municipal Code Chapter 18.116 are allowable. Where conflicts occur between

Chapter 18.116 and the Foothill–Central Specific Plan, the provisions of Chapter 18.116 shall govern.”

“Table 5-2 – Development Standards

Notes:

Within parcels identified as part of the Housing Opportunity District (HOD), residential uses permitted under Rialto Municipal Code Chapter 18.116 are allowable. Where conflicts occur between Chapter 18.116 and the Foothill–Central Specific Plan, the provisions of Chapter 18.116 shall govern.”

SECTION 4. The City Council hereby directs staff to prepare, execute, and file with the San Bernardino County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors a Notice of Determination within five (5) working days of the adoption of the Ordinance.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, which shall remain in effect absent the provision held to be invalid and, to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 6. The Mayor shall sign this Ordinance and the City Clerk shall certify as to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause a copy thereof to be published within fifteen (15) days of the adoption and shall post a certified copy of this Ordinance, including the vote for and against the same, in the Office of the City Clerk, in accordance with Government Code Section 36933.
