## **Outreach Strategy**

The Bike Rodeo event had a raffle and in order to enter the raffle community members had to stop at various information booths and obtain a stamp to demonstrate their participation, including the KOA booth. Staff had the community members vote between two Cactus Trail alternatives. Community members were also given the opportunity to vote for some of the amenities throughout the trail, such as monument sign options, educational signage, and rest area exercise equipment. Staff explained the two different options for the Cactus Trail Improvements to all the participants and answered any remaining questions they had. Participants were engaged in English and Spanish where at least 50% of the participants spoke only Spanish. There were two staff members fluent in Spanish and were able to interact and obtain their feedback.

### **Input on Cactus Trail Alternatives**

Alternative 1




 Many participants expressed a consensus that Alternative 1 would be a safer option for pedestrians, since the rest area is located further away from the street than Alternative 2. Participants stated that it would be safer for pedestrians walking and resting to be closer to the channel and away from the vehicles along Cactus since it would create a buffer.

#### Alternative 2



• Some participants felt Alternative 2 would be a preferable option since it eliminates the need to continuously cross the bike trail to get to the rest area if you are a cyclist.






**Cactus Trail Improvements: Monument Signs**

- A participant expressed how having a combination of both option 1 and option 2 would be preferred since it is equally important to know about how the City was developed as well as water history and conservation.


