

- Serves as a comprehensive policy document for informing future decisions.
- Help shape and improve quality of life for residents and businesses.
- General Plans are required to have the following elements:
 - ✓ Land Use
 - ✓ Circulation
 - ✓ Housing
 - ✓ Conservation
 - ✓ Open Space

- ✓ Environmental Justice*





Land Use, Safety, and Circulation Elements' Purpose

 The Land Use Element is being updated to retain consistency with the newly updated Housing Element.

 The Safety Element is required to be updated to meet certain laws related to climate change projections, vulnerable populations, and evacuation.

 The Circulation Element is updating transportation data and truck route figure



Environmental Justice Element Overview

The Environmental Justice Element is brand new for Rialto. Environmental justice is the fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

Its requirements are shaped by Senate Bill 1000, and generally covers 6 pillars:

1. Access to Healthy Food

2. Promote Exercise

- Access to Parks
- Safe Walking and Biking

3. Reduce Pollution

- Air Pollution
- Hazardous Materials

4. Access to Public Facilities

- Public Transportation
- Libraries and Community Centers

5. Promote Safe and Sanitary Homes

6. Promote Civic Engagement

The City of Rialto is preparing a Focused General Plan Update for Land Use, Safety, and Circulation Elements to be in compliance with new state regulations. Additionally, the City is developing its first Environmental Justice Element. The Environmental Justice Element will include policies related to pollution, public facilities, food, civic engagement, access to transit, physical activity and more.

 - Received comments from 2 residents and 1 agency








Engagement Schedule








Making Connections - Circulation Chapter






Managing Our Land Supply



Updates/Additions include:

- An updated Land Use Map to reflect Housing Element
- Additional opportunities for retail/commercial uses to create vibrant centers within the City
- Emphasis on annexation of unincorporated islands
- Addressing land use incompatibilities related to industrials
- Enhancement of public gathering spaces through temporary uses
- Allow more resident-serving facilities such as grocery stores




Environmental Justice
