Mayor Pro Tem Scott commented that staff has done a good job with implementation. He commented that better work needs to be done with the Mobile Home Program related to repairs to mobile home parks that are unsafe. Better outreach program needs to take place to inform mobile home park senior residents that funds are available to assist them with items such water heaters, roofs, and air conditioning

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Council Member Carrizales requested that the information be available in a bilingual format.

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Mayor Baca emphasized the importance of allocating all unused funds available appropriately to make the most use of it.

He appreciated the allocation of funds from CDBG members to the creation of an all-inclusive playground for children with disabilities.

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Mr. Orona stated they will be mindful of the type of trees selected and their placements.

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Tatiana Reyes Arabis addressed the City Council regarding a Chamber of Commerce and unrelated to TAB 3. She commented on remarks made by a business owner related to the City of Rialto being 100 years behind the City of Fontana and the length of time it takes to start a business in Rialto. She is asking the City Council to consider allocating funds to the Rialto Chamber of Commerce similar to the City of Fontana to establish better connections with Rialto residents.

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Mayor Baca stated that the City of Rialto does their best to accommodate individuals with everything they need to conduct business. We welcome businesses to Rialto. It's up to the Rialto Chamber of Commerce to work with the City and provide information back to the public.

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City Attorney Vail stated that this is not on the agenda and should not have more discussions on this matter.

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Mayor Baca stated he understands, but he will overrule it.

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Tatiana Reyes commented that everyone at the Chamber are volunteers. No one gets paid. She believes the City needs to partner with the Chamber of Commerce

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Mayor Baca stated that the City will be attending the upcoming mixer.
