Public Hearing Items

- **2025 Regional Urban Water Management Plan (2025 RUWMP)**
 - Evaluates the City's and the Region's near-term and long-term water service reliability under various hydrologic scenarios
 - Demonstrates conservation efforts and outcomes
 - Meets the City's reporting requirements under the UWMP Act
- **Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP)**
 - Describes the City's planned actions to prevent or respond to actual water shortage conditions, if they occur

Background

- The California Water Code requires urban water suppliers to prepare and adopt Urban Water Management Plans (UWMPs) for submission to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR)
- UWMPs are required every five years and must satisfy the requirements of the UWMP Act.
- The UWMP Act requires urban water suppliers serving 3,000 or more connections or supplying more than 3,000 acre-feet (AF) of water each year, to complete a UWMP.
- Water suppliers within a region may work together to develop a cooperative Regional UWMP (RUWMP), which the Region has done since 2010
