Motion by Council Member Trujillo, second by Council Member Scott and carried by a 5-0 vote to adopt the Consent Calendar with the exception of D,1, D.2 and D.3.

Paul Gonzales, Community Development Manager, presented staff report: Specific Plan Amendment No. 2022-0001: Request the City Council Conduct a Public Hearing to consider Adoption of (1) Resolution No. 8095 approving Specific Plan Amendment No. 2022-0001, a request to change the specific plan zoning designation of approximately 1.67 acres of land from Commercial - Mixed Use (C-MU) to Residential - High Density (R-HD), (2) Resolution No. 8096 approving Precise Plan of Design No. 2022-0025, a request for site and architectural review for the development of a 21-unit apartment complex with 5 Accessory Dwelling Units and (3) Resolution No. 8097 approving an Addendum to the Foothill Boulevard Specific Plan Mitigated Negative Declaration (Environmental Assessment Review No. 2022-0037) prepared for the project, in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The project site is located on the east side of Cactus Avenue approximately 360 feet south of Foothill Boulevard.

Mayor Robertson asked if anyone wished to speak.

000

Deputy City Clerk Rodriguez stated no.

000

Motion by Council Member Scott and second by Mayor Pro Tem Carrizales carried by a 5-0 vote to close the public hearing.

000

Council Member Baca stated the beautification of the area will enhance the City and its outlook and change image of the City. He appreciates City staff addressing the City Council concerns such as the parking matter.

000

Council Member Scott asked about comments sent back to the City by the community.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated no comments were received.

000

Council Member Scott asked about an email related to the project would not be allowed to park at the parking lot near the trail.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated there were initial discussions in reference to a parking lot on the southwest corner of Cactus Avenue and Foothill Boulevard. There will not be a parking lot on the west side.

Council Member Scott asked if a parking lot will ever be built.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated currently there is no plan.

000

Council Member Scott emphasized that the City Council has a plan to build a parking lot at that location.

000

Mayor Robertson agreed.

000

Council Member Scott asked when a parking lot is built by the direction of the City Council, will residents or visitors of the complex be allowed to park at that location.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated it will be a public parking lot. Conditions on the parking lot can be placed such as hours of operation.

000

Council Member Scott stated that should it become a public parking lot, anyone can park in that parking lot. He asked for clarification of the lot was a public parking lot.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated yes.

000

Council Member Scott emphasized that the City would have to determine to restrict parking hours on a public parking lot which he does not foresee happening.

He asked if the units have additional parking space in front of the unit besides the two spaces in the garage.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated there are a few parking spaces at the rear and in front of the site. Nothing on the drive aisle.

000

Council Member Scott asked if street parking allowed.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated no. There will be a condition placed in front of the project site indicating "no parking will be permitted".

Council Member Scott asked for the width of the streets through the project.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated 26 feet wide.

000

Council Member Trujillo stated there are no parking signs on both sides of Cactus Avenue. Residents of the area park on the embankment.

He asked about the possibility of residents parking at local store parking lots. He asked what the parking restrictions would be in that scenario.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated currently there are no restrictions on private parking lots. They are allowed if the property owner allows it.

000

Council Member Trujillo stated it's an area with a lot of parking tension. There is hardly anything available. He hopes there is a resolution to the limited parking. He believes there may not be enough parking, and it would add more problem to the situation. He hopes for efforts to add a public parking lot to ease the tension.

000

Mayor Robertson agreed that parking is limited and made clear that the parking lot to be built will be public access.

She asked about assigned parking spaces for each unit or is it first-come, first-served.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated each unit will have a two-car enclosed garage. It's only required to have a one-car enclosed garage, but two were provided. Additional parking is for guests.

000

Mayor Robertson expressed concerns related to the apartment units individually turned into separate units and sold. It is understood that property owner would need to agree on placing parcel restrictions prohibiting the subdivision of the parcels unless the City agrees to it.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated that's correct.

000

Council Member Scott stated the agreement is in the package.

Mayor Robertson expressed her concerns related to community comments received if public notice had not been distributed to the community of the pending project. If there were no community meetings, how would community comments be received.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated one resident attended at the June 13, 2023, City Council meeting and expressed concerns of a wall. He received the notice. He was within 660 feet.

000

Mayor Pro Tem Carrizales asked which City Council meeting did the resident attend.

000

Mr. Gonzales believed it was June 13, 2023, City Council meeting.

000

Mayor Robertson suggested residents share with their neighbors of pending construction. She recommends City staff notify the public of the upcoming project.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated City staff can visit the area and speak to residents and inform them in person.

000

Mayor Robertson asked shouldn't it be the developer's responsibility.

000

Council Member Scott stated they should be provided with the construction schedule, so they are informed.

000

City Attorney Vail stated legal notice was given to residents within 660 feet of the project.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated yes.

000

Mayor Robertson stated she was informed the City had not.

000

City Attorney clarified Mr. Gonzales comments that property owners within 660 feet were given separate notice twice.

Mayor Robertson emphasized that the construction schedule should be provided so the community is well informed and who they should be contacting regarding the project.

000

Council Member Scott agreed with Mayor Robertson.

He stated of the new state regulations on apartment complexes where the number of parking spaces required are being reduced to ultimately decrease the number of cars.

He requested that City staff provide the City Council information on the parking requirements and reduction of parking requirements. It's important for the City Council to be aware of the new law.

000

Interim City Manager Garcia stated it will be provided this week.

000

Council Member Trujillo asked if there will be plenty of trees on the property line.

000

Mr. Gonzales stated the City has been provided a landscape plan. There will be trees planted.

000

Mr. Cervantes stated the County's design phase is close to completion. It will then go to bid. He estimates the project will be completed in 12 months.

Council Member Scott asked on the status of the signals at Willlow Avenue and San Bernardino Avenue.

Mr. Cervantes confirmed the project was awarded to Baker Electric at the July 25, 2023, City Council meeting. Currently waiting on receiving documentation from contractor to obtain signatures through DocuSign.

Council Member Scott asked if the Easton Street and Cactus project will include left-turn signals.

Mr. Cervantes stated there will be stripping modifications to allow a left-turn.
