2	RIALTO, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A POLICY		
4	GOVERNING THE USE OF BUDGETED DISCRETIONARY FUNDS BY CITY COUNCILMEMBERS		
5	WHEREAS, from time to time, the City Council includes funding in the City's budget for		
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9	for each Councilmember identified as community benefit funds ("Community Benefit Funds"); and		
10	WHEREAS, the City Council anticipates that future City Budgets will include allocations		
11	for Community Benefit Funds in amounts subject to City Council review and approval in such future		
12	budgets; and		
13	WHEREAS, by adoption of this Resolution the City Council desires to establish a policy		
14	governing how budgeted Community Benefit Funds may be expended by individual		
15	Councilmembers.		
16	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Rialto,		
17	does hereby resolve as follows:		
18	Section 1. Community Benefit Funds. Community Benefit Funds may be spent on one or		
19	more of the following eligible expenses:		
20	• Contributions to community based not-for-profit organizations that provide services or		
21	assistance to residents of the City;		
22	• Contributions to programs, services, assistance, teams or clubs offered at or through		
23	schools or other community organizations located within the City or that otherwise serve		
24	students or residents of the City;		
25	• Contributions to scholarships, grants, awards, or recognition programs for students or		
26	residents of the City;		
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1	•	Contributions to job training, job placement, occupational education, work force
2		development and similar programs provided to residents of the City;
3	•	Contributions in support of the arts within the community that are available to residents
4		of the community;
5	•	Contributions in support of social, economic, or environmental justice and equality that
6		benefit the community;
7	•	Contributions to City, school, or community events, fairs, festivals, parades, concerts,
8		tournaments, farmers markets, community gardens and similar activities;
9	•	Contributions in support of local athletic teams, events, programs, or activities for
10		residents of the community;
11	•	Contributions in support of not-for-profit services or programs providing access to
12		physical and mental health resources to residents of the City;
13	•	Contributions in support of healthy eating programs, food banks, meals on wheels,
14		school lunch programs, and similar programs assisting residents with nutritional
15		necessities;
16	•	Contributions to legal aid, tenant advocacy and similar programs available to residents;
17	•	Contributions to grant or aid programs for local businesses;
18	•	Purchase of tickets, tables, or sponsorships for community events;
19	•	Payment of City fees applicable to special events at City facilities hosted by community
20		based not-for-profit organizations that provide services or assistance to students and/or
21		residents of the City;
22	•	Purchase of equipment, supplies, or other resources for community organizations; and,
23	•	Such other expenditures which the City Council may, from time to time determine are
24		within the spirit and intent of this policy and provide benefit to the community. Such
25		determination may be made by amendment to this policy or by order of the City Council
26		entered into its official meeting minutes.
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1	Section 2. Disbursement and Limitations on Use. Individual Councilmembers may directly		
2	authorize the expenditure of available funds from their Community Benefit Fund for any of the uses		
3	identified as allowable in the foregoing list. Under no circumstances may Community Benefit Funds		
4	be used for the personal financial benefit of the Councilmember or be provided to for-profit		
5	businesses, used for campaign contributions, or for any use that would constitute a gift of public		
6	funds under California Law.		
7	Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect from and after the date of its passage and		
8	adoption.
