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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIALTO, CALIFORNIA, CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION ON APRIL 10, 2018 TO VOTE ON A MEASURE TO CONTINUE THE UTILITY USER TAX FOR 5 ADDITIONAL YEARS IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN THE CURRENT LEVEL OF CITY SERVICES FOR THE RESIDENTS OF RIALTO; ORDERING THE SUBMITTAL OF THE ORDINANCE TO THE VOTERS AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION; REQUESTING THE SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO RENDER THE **SPECIFIED SERVICES** TO CITY RELATING \mathbf{A} SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION ADMINISTERED BY THE CITY'S ELECTIONS OFFICIAL AND DIRECTING 2018 AND ELECTIONS OFFICIAL TO CONDUCT THE ELECTION

WHEREAS, in or about 2003, the voters of the City of Rialto approved by a simple majority for a term of 5 years the Utility Users Tax of 8% on telephone, cellular, electricity, gas, sewer, water and cable television utilities within the City of Rialto for the purpose of raising general fund revenue to provide basic services for residents, including but not limited to, law enforcement and fire protection services; and

WHEREAS, the voters of the City of Rialto approved extensions of the Utility Users Tax in 2008 and in 2013; and

WHEREAS, the term of the existing Utility Users Tax is set to expire on June 30, 2018;

WHEREAS, extending the term of the Utility Users Tax requires approval of the majority of voters at either a general or special municipal election; and

WHEREAS, on ______, ___, 2017, the City Council unanimously adopted Resolution No.______ declaring a fiscal emergency now exists in the City of Rialto, based upon facts and findings therein, as the term "emergency" is used in Article XIIIC, Section 2(b) of the California Constitution; and

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WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized and directed by statute to submit to the voters the ballot measure, and the City Council therefore wishes to have the voters consider the same at a special municipal election to be held on April 10, 2018; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Rialto does hereby resolve, declare, determine and order as follows:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2: Pursuant to Article XIIIC, Section 2(b) of the California Constitution, Government Code Section 53724, and Elections Code Sections 306, 9222, and 1301 the City Council hereby calls a special election on April 10, 2018 at which it shall submit to the qualified voters of the City of Rialto a measure, which if approved, will continue the City's Utility User Tax, a general tax. As required by Elections Code Section 13247, the abbreviated form of the measure to appear on the ballot is specified below. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to make any changes to the text of the proposition or this resolution as required to conform to any requirements of law.

Section 3: Pursuant to Government Code Section 53724, the measure, contained in the Ordinance attached hereto as Exhibit "A", proposes to amend the Utility User Tax Ordinance of the City of Rialto, codified as Chapter 3.16 of the Rialto Municipal Code, to continue the Utility User Tax for an additional 5 years. The type of tax proposed by the Ordinance is a general tax currently charged to utility users in the City of Rialto. The rate of tax to be levied by the Ordinance is 8%, which is the same rate now in effect. The tax on the affected utility users shall be collected by the City. The date upon which the election shall be held on the issue is April 10, 2018.

Section 4: The City Council, pursuant to its right and authority, hereby orders that, at the Special Municipal Election on April 10, 2018, the ballot measure concerning the measure discussed above shall be presented and printed upon the ballot submitted to the qualified voters the following question:

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Shall the measure extending the existing 8% Utility User Tax on telephone, cellular, electricity, gas, sewer, water and cable	YES	
television, by an additional five years to June 30, 2023, to raise approximately \$14 million annually, to continue basic and essential services for residents while preserving exemptions for senior citizens and members of low-income households, be	NO	
adopted?		

Section 5: That the text of the Ordinance to be submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit "A" to this resolution.

Section 6: That the vote requirement for the measure to pass is a majority (50% +1) of the votes cast.

Section 7: That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law, and that the election shall be held and conducted in the manner prescribed by law.

Section 8: That the City Council authorizes its City Clerk to administer the election and is authorized, instructed, and directed to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

Section 9: Pursuant to California Election Code § 10242, the polls for the Special Municipal Election shall open at seven o'clock a.m. on the day of the election, and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, except as otherwise provided in California Election Code § 14401.

Section 10: That in all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the Special Municipal Election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating municipal and statewide elections.

Section 11: That notice of the time and place of holding the Special Municipal Election is hereby given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in the time, form and manner required by law.

Section 12: That pursuant to the provisions of Elections Code Section 10002, this City Council requests the Board of Supervisors of San Bernardino County to permit the San Bernardino
