## Code Enforcement Curb Appeal Review

### Questions for consideration.

- Should trash cans in the front yard be screened?
- How should Code Enforcement enforce a curb appeal issue (warning, Notice of Violation, Administrative Citation, etc.)?
- Should a vehicle be allowed to park on grass or other non-paved surfaces in the front yard?
- Should front yards have stringent or lenient curb appeal?
- Should Code Enforcement only cite the property with the violation (based on complaint received) or cite every property on the same block with similar and/or other curb appeal violation(s)?
- Should the City again enforce prohibiting brown yards, weeds, dirt, etc. in the front yard since the draught has ended?
- Should parties making complaints remain anonymous?

## Should trash cans in the front yard be screened?

• "18.72.010(K) Garbage or trash cans or containers stored in front or side yard areas without adequate screening and visible from any public street, property, or right-of-way any garbage or trash cans placed out for pick-up prior to sunrise of the day before refuse pick-up or not removed on or before sunset of the date after refuse pick-up."

VS.

• "18.72.010(K) Garbage or trash cans or containers stored in front or side yard areas without adequate screening and visible from any public street, property, or right-of-way any garbage or trash cans-placed out for pick-up prior to sunrise of the day before refuse pick-up or not removed on or before sunset of the date after refuse pick-up."

- Current enforcement in Rialto and different cities, issue notices for trash bins in public view.
- Options are removing trash bins from street/ sidewalk or leaving them curbside.

# How should Code Enforcement enforce a curb appeal issue (warning, Notice of Violation, Administrative Citation, etc.)?

- Rialto along with other cities initially administer a Courtesy Notice,
   Notice of Violation, Administrative Citation, or a Parking Ticket (When applicable)
- Options include providing each violation with a certain time frame for follow up.
- Obtaining a fee schedule for each type of violation and collecting fees through a third party collection agency.

#### Citation Information

#### A. Compliance Period

If your Administrative Citation includes a compliance period within which you can avoid the fine, you must take action to avoid the fine, In order to avoid the fine, you must:

- a. Make all corrections as outlined.
- b. Have the work inspected and signed off by the Code Enforcement Division of the City of Rialto. In order to schedule an inspection for the following work day, you are required to call (909) 820-2636 for next day inspection. You may also appear at the Code Enforcement Offices (246 S. Willow Avenue) and request an inspection for the following work day.

#### B. Collection of Fines

Each violation of the Code constitutes a nuisance and the collection of any unpaid fines or nuisance abatement cost may be enforced as an assessment or lien against the real property where the code violation occurred. Unpaid assessments can result in the property being sold after three years by The County Tax Collector.

Payments are to be made by check, money order or credit card at the City of Rialto Finance Department located at 150 S. Palm Rialto CA 92376. Please Do Not Send Cash. Checks may be mailed to this same address and please include a copy of the citation along with your payment.

#### C. Administrative Hearings

Any person to whom a citation has been issued may contest the citation and the proposed fine or fines by filing a written request for an administrative hearing. To request a hearing, the cite shall sign and file this request form ALONG WITH A CHECK OR MONEY ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF THE FINE OR PROOF OF CREDIT CARD PAYMENT WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS OF THE DATE THAT THE CITATION WAS ISSUED. If the hearing officer finds in the citee's favor, the fine amount will be returned within 30 days. The only reasons that an appeal will be heard are listed below. You may not raise any issue or defense at the hearing that is not included on this request form.

Failure to appear at the administrative hearing shall constitute a waiver of your right to a hearing on the citation and any defenses to the citation that you may have.

All hearings will take place at: City of Rialto - Code Enforcement Building located at 246 S. Willow Avenue Rialto, CA 92376.

## Should a vehicle be allowed to park on grass or other non-paved surfaces in the front yard?

- Parking is not allowed on any surface other than paved. Rialto and other cities enforce this code by issuing Courtesy Notices, Notice of Violation, Administrative Citations, or the issuing a parking ticket.
- Options are allowing vehicles to park on lawns and dirt.
- Allow vehicles to park on lawn only during street sweeping days.
- Provide short term follow-up for this violation.

## Should front yards have stringent or lenient curb appeal?

- Violations for curb appeal or property standards can vary at each location. Rialto along with other cities continue to use both stringent and lenient enforcement.
- Allowing residents who contact the Code Officers to ask for extensions or provide a plan of action will be handled leniently.
- If a notice is issued to a property and communication is not made, the Code Officer will move forward with a case.

- Options for a more stringent approach would include starting with Notice of Violation instead of a Courtesy Notice.
- For a more lenient approach you can give multiple notices for the same violation.

# Should Code Enforcement only cite the property with the violation (based on complaint received) or cite every property on the same block with similar and/or other curb appeal violation(s)?

- The intention is always to be fair, other properties of higher priority may need to be addressed in a timely manner. For Example, a Code Officer has a high volume of cases for the day, or they have an appointment with a resident, leaving the area may take precedent. It is up to the Officer to determine the timeline for addressing neighboring property violations.
- Options are to schedule days to do sweeps on certain violations in neighborhoods.
- Stop and address each property for the same violation.

# Should the City again enforce prohibiting brown yards, weeds, dirt, etc. in the front yard since the draught has ended?

- As of now Code Enforcement Officers are not issuing notices to provide new landscaping. A drought measure from the state has not been established to reverse the policy. However, we are still enforcing poorly maintained lawns to prevent weeds and remove dead or overgrown vegetation.
- Some cities have lifted the ban based on their local watering regulations. The policy was changed by the vote of their city Council.

• The city of Rialto is currently in the Stage 2 water alert. This allows water usage for landscaping four days a week between 8pm and 6am for 10 minutes per station. The alert asks residents to stop watering for 48 hours of measurable rainfall. City council can change the policy to effectively enforce new landscaping in front yards. There are many ways a property can be brought into compliance regarding landscaping. Some options include seeding, sod, desert landscape, and artificial turf with a percentage of live plant materials.

# Should parties making complaints remain anonymous?

- Most anonymous complaints are just quick calls to give Code Officers information on keeping up the neighborhood. It ensures the stoppage of retaliation by the property owner in violation. In some cases, the complaints are on neighbors who they have known for years. The city also provides Complaint forms that residents can fill out. It allows them to put their name, phone number, email, and the complaint.
- Continue to accept anonymous complaints.
- No longer accept complaints without name, phone number or email.
