Subject: Results of the habitat assessment for the Delhi Sands Flower-loving Fly (*Rhaphiomidas terminatus abdominalis*, DSF) on a 2.18 acre site in the City of Rialto, San Bernardino County, California (APN Numbers 0132-031-03 and 21).

We received your email containing the habitat assessment results for DSF on parcel Numbers 0132-031-03 and 21 in the City of Rialto, on March 27, 2018. The site assessment was performed by permitted entomologist Ken Osborne, PhD of Osborn Biological Consulting.

The assessment stated the southwestern portion (0.25 acres) of the area was mapped as Delhi fine sands, the rest of the parcel contains Tujunga soils. Delhi sands found on site were found to be highly disturbed through development and unsuitable for DSF.

Based on the habitat assessment results for parcels, it is our conclusion that it is unlikely that DSF will be affected by the construction of the project. This determination is reliant on the assessment result discussed above.
