

1 convenience stores, mini-marts, pharmacies and similar businesses (“Grocery Stores”) to
2 implement the protective measures for their employees, workers, and members of the
3 community, to the greatest extent feasible and practicable for the duration of the local
4 emergency:

- 5 1. Limit the occupancy of persons at any given time in a store to 50% of
6 capacity;
- 7 2. Enforce social distancing requirements by marking down the floors inside
8 and outside stores with indicators as well as posted signs to remind
9 customers and employees of 6-foot social distancing requirements;
- 10 3. Designate a specific entrance and exit for customers;
- 11 4. Have one family member shop at a time;
- 12 5. Assign employees to monitor and regulate customer entry into the store;
- 13 6. Companies should follow all applicable Cal-OSHA regulations, rules and
14 guidelines including those pertaining to prevention of COVID-19 infection;
- 15 7. Companies should allow for sufficient amount of time overnight to allow
16 for stores to be properly sanitized and restocked;
- 17 8. Post signs for customers and for employees on what the rules are;
- 18 9. Employee, workers and customers should properly dispose of their own
19 personal protective equipment (“PPE”);
- 20 10. Treat employees with respect;
- 21 11. Provide hand sanitizer, soap and water, or effective disinfectant at or near
22 the entrance of the store or in other appropriate areas for use by the public
23 and employees and in locations where there is high-frequency employee
24 interaction with members of the public;
- 25 12. Posting signs in conspicuous place at all public entries that instructs
26 members of the public not to enter if they are experiences symptoms of
27 respiratory illness, including fever or cough;

- 1 13. Provide non-medical face masks (not “face coverings”) and gloves for
2 employees at the expense of the employer and allow employees to wash
3 hands as needed;
- 4 14. Install Plexiglas shields at all points of sale whenever possible;
- 5 15. Maintain security onsite to enforce social distancing measures and
6 safeguard employees from unruly customers;
- 7 16. Inform employees of what precautions they will take when an employee
8 tests positive for COVID-19 and to the best of their ability inform affected
9 employees without violating HIPPA when a co-worker within a store tests
10 positive for COVID-19;
- 11 17. All essential businesses, as indicated by the Governor’s Stay at Home
12 Order, including Grocery Stores, are strongly encouraged to utilize their
13 ability to refuse service to customers who are not wearing face masks;
14 and,
- 15 18. Grocery Stores are encouraged to provide customers, without charge,
16 reusable grocery bags or recycled paper bags, or where not possible, to
17 provide single-use carryout bags, at point-of-sale, consistent with the
18 Governor’s Executive Order N-54-20, and to encourage customers to not
19 bring their own reusable bags into Grocery Stores.

20 **SECTION TWO.** The City Council authorizes the Director of Emergency Services to
21 provide a copy of this Resolution to grocery stores, convenience stores, mini-marts,
22 pharmacies and similar businesses operating within the City of Rialto and/or to take such
23 other actions as may be reasonably necessary to educate store owners, managers, and
24 employees regarding the recommended protective measures.

25 **SECTION THREE.** This Resolution shall terminate and be of no further force and
26 effect upon the cancelation I of the local emergency by the City Council or Director of
27 Emergency Services ..

1 **SECTION FOUR.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by
2 the City Council. The City Clerk shall attest to and certify the vote adopting this Resolution.
