## **RESOLUTION NO.**

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIALTO AFFIRMING THAT RACISM IS A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS THAT RESULTS IN DISPARITIES IN FAMILY STABILITY, HEALTH AND MENTAL WELLNESS, EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, PUBLIC SAFETY, CRIMINAL JUSTICE, AND HOUSING, AS WELL AS DECLARING THE CITY'S SUPPORT OF THE COUNTY'S EFFORTS TO EXPAND AND IMPROVE THE COUNTYWIDE VISION BY IMPLEMENTING AN ELEMENT ON "EQUITY" AND ENCOURAGE ALL OTHER AGENCIES TO ALSO LEGISLATE SUCH SUPPORT AND THEREBY ENSURING A UNIFIED VOICE AMONG ALL LOCAL AGENCY EFFORTS IN THIS REGARD

WHEREAS, racism results in the structuring of opportunity and assigning of value based solely on skin color and other physical characteristics, which creates unfair disadvantages to some individuals and communities and unfair advantages to other individuals and communities, therefore preventing societies as a whole from achieving their full potential; and

WHEREAS, throughout history, racism has manifested as discrimination and oppression directed toward numerous populations, resulting in trauma, terror, and long-term physical and mental health impairments for the targets of racism, their communities, and subsequent generations; and

**WHEREAS**, the United States Office of Disease Prevention recognizes that discrimination negatively impacts health outcomes; and

**WHEREAS**, in its Vision, Mission, Values and Goals, the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health states that its values include, "We ensure that all individuals and communities have equal opportunity for health and well-being"; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Census Bureau has documented a significant increase in anxiety and depression among Black people nationally following the May 25, 2020 killing of George Floyd; and

1 WHEREAS, the Countywide Vision adopted by the Board of Supervisors and elected 2 representatives of all twenty-four San Bernardino County incorporated Cities and Towns (including the City of Rialto) on June 30, 2011 begins with the words, "We envision a complete County that capitalizes 3 4 on the diversity of its people"; and 5 **WHEREAS**, the City of Rialto proudly proclaims as part of its vision: 6 7 8 RIALTO 9 Entering a Second Century of Progress 10 • Rialto will be a Family First Community 11 • Rialto Shall Attract High-Quality Development and Improve its Physical Environment 12 • Rialto's Economic Environment will be Healthy and Diverse 13 • Rialto will be an Active Community 14 15 WHEREAS, racism creates disparate outcomes in many areas of life that serve as the elemental 16 foundation of the Countywide Vision, including housing, education, employment and the economy, 17 public safety and criminal justice, and physical and behavioral health; and 18 19 WHEREAS, specific physical and behavioral health conditions stemming from racism include depression, anxiety anger, hypertension, stroke, heart attack, diabetes, maternal death, premature birth, 20 21 respiratory diseases, and autoimmune diseases; and 22 23 WHEREAS, racism has given rise to geographic segregation that disproportionately exposes 24 people of color to lead poisoning, poor air quality, inadequate nutrition, and under-resourced 25 recreational and healthcare facilities; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the infant mortality rate with San Bernardino County's Black population is more 28 than double the rate for the County as a whole; and

**WHEREAS**, Black people account for less than 9 percent of the County's population but almost 19 percent of the County jail bookings and 38 percent of the bookings into County juvenile detention facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 21 percent of the County's homeless population is Black and available housing and homeownership is impacted by affordability; and

**WHEREAS**, in San Bernardino County, only 17 percent of Black students compared to more than 31 percent of all students are proficient in math and less than 35 percent of Black students compared to almost 45 percent of all students are proficient in English/Language Arts; and

**WHEREAS**, helping people process the trauma of past injustice and create new narratives based upon equity, fairness, and equal justice can have healing effects, both mentally and physically.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Rialto affirms that racism is a public health crisis that results in disparities in family stability, health and mental wellness, education, employment, economic development, public safety, criminal justice, and housing, as well as declaring the City's support of the County's efforts to expand and improve the Countywide Vision by implementing an Element on "Equity" and also encourage all other agencies to also legislate such support and thereby ensuring a unified voice among all local agency efforts in this regard.

Furthermore, based upon this resolution, the City of Rialto affirms its full support of the County's efforts in the dismantling of racism by:

1) Volunteering to serve on the County's Equity Element Group as the first step toward eradicating racism countywide, wherever it might be found.

- 2) Collaborate with the County's law and justice agencies through the work of the Equity Element Group to participate in meaningful dialogues on the provision of public safety countywide in support of the Equity Element Group's work.
- 3) Review and consider policies of the County's Equity Element Group aimed at addressing and dismantling racism, and how racism impacts our community and communities.
- 4) Review and continue to improve upon specific activities to enhance diversity with the City's workforce.
- 5) Advocate through the League of California Cities, the National League of Cities, the US Conference of Mayors, Government Alliance on Race and Equity (GARE), and other such organizations, to ensure that systematic racism is dismantled and replaced with equity.
- 6) Supporting community efforts to amplify issues of racism and engaging actively and authentically with communities of color throughout the County and our City.
- 7) Support and participate in the County's efforts to study and review existing County policies and practices, that can be considered and replicated at the City of Rialto, through a lens of racial equity to promote and support policies that prioritize health in an equitable way, especially for people of color by mitigating exposure to adverse childhood experiences.
- 8) Hereby encourage all Cities and Towns of the County of San Bernardino to also adopt resolutions as detailed herein and legislate complete support thereto.
