1. PROBLEM STATEMENT

The Rialto Police Department's Traffic division is currently staffed with (1) Corporal, (3) motors and (1) nighttime DUI Enforcement/Accident Investigation (DUI/AI) officer. The four Traffic enforcement officers cover our City (28 sq miles) from 0630 to 0030 hrs Monday thru Friday. These (4) officers are responsible for traffic enforcement, DUIs, and collision investigations. In 2021, our department will be in the position to increase the Traffic division's staffing to (1) Sergeant, (1) Corporal, (6) Motorcycle Officers, (4) DUI/AI investigators and (2) Commercial Enforcement Officers.

The City of Rialto is located in the western portion of the San Bernardino County approximately 19 miles east of the east Los Angeles County line. Rialto's population is over 105,000 residents with an area of about 28 square miles. The City of Rialto sits in the middle of the I-210 to its north, the I-10 to the south, the I-215 to the east and the I-15 to the west. Traversing in and out of Rialto and the surrounding areas, there are thousands of roadway miles (almost 1 million miles driven per year on our roadways) and during most of the day, extremely congested. In the last couple years, Rialto has experienced booms in the construction of homes, large retail complexes, and super warehouses such as Under Armour, Amazon, Target, Niagara Water, Apple, and others. This growth has not only increased the density of the commercial areas, but it brings with it thousands of more trucks, cars, and motorcycles on our roadways causing more congestion, traffic violations, and crashes.

In 2020, the Rialto Police Department issued 8,208 moving, equipment, misdemeanor, and administrative citations. The citations require the subsequent manual entry of citation data into the department's Records Management System (RMS) after which they are hand delivered each day to the Traffic Court in Fontana and the Superior Court in Rancho Cucamonga. The data entry and citation delivery portions of this workflow is a huge drain on our Records personnel.

The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.

9. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph 5 of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is proposed for debarment under 48 CFR part 9, subpart 9.4, suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension or debarment.

<u>Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion -- Lower Tier Covered</u> <u>Transactions:</u>

1. The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participating in covered transactions by any Federal department or agency.

2. Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.

BUY AMERICA ACT

(applies to subrecipients as well as States)

The State and each subrecipient will comply with the Buy America requirement (23 U.S.C. 313) when purchasing items using Federal funds. Buy America requires a State, or subrecipient, to purchase with Federal funds only steel, iron and manufactured products produced in the United States, unless the Secretary of Transportation determines that such domestically produced items would be inconsistent with the public interest, that such materials are not reasonably available and of a satisfactory quality, or that inclusion of domestic materials will increase the cost of the overall project contract by more than 25 percent. In order to use Federal
